What's on offer?

Homeowners will be able to apply for a voucher to fund up to two thirds of the cost of upgrading the energy performance of their home. The vouchers will pay up to two thirds of eligible improvements up to the value of £5,000.

Low income households are eligible to claim up to 100% funding, to the value of £10,000.

What energy efficient improvements are included?

- Roof, wall, and floor insulation
- Air or ground source heat pumps
- 💈 Solar thermal
- Replacing single to double or triple glazed windows
- Energy-efficient doors
- Hot water tank/appliance tank thermostats/ heating controls

How to get involved

TrustMark and the BMF have teamed up to provide all the information you need to check whether you already meet the requirements or need training to become certified. This leaflet will help you identify what steps you need to take.

Key points

- Vouchers are available for up to two thirds of eligible improvements up to the value of £5,000
- Up to £10,000 for low income households, with up to 100% funding
- Only TrustMark Registered Businesses can undertake the installation of the work
- Businesses will need to be suitably PAS 2030 and MCS certified. Conditions apply
- Scheme is available until March 2021
- FREE training is available on how to become certified and registered
